- The College is handicapped by shortage of sanctioned teaching & non-teaching staff in different departments.
- Poor academic standard of students at the entry level is a constant cause of worry.
- Absence of adequate number of books and journals in the library especially for research activities and also the post of the librarian is still vacant due to the demise of the librarian.
- Till date no Govt. Concurrence and Financial assistance is received for the science stream.
- Most of the departments of the science stream is run by temporary teachers due to paucity of fund.
- The College is located at Indo-Bangla border on the one side and in the other side by the state boundary of Meghalaya.

Opportunities:

- Better utilisation of the ICT and other facilities.
- Developing scientific temper and research culture.
- Developing good communicative and vocational skills.
- Strengthening interdisciplinary study to enhance creativity.

Threats:

- Migration of good students to the other parts of the state as well as the country.
- Absence of career based vocational courses.
- Economic status of majority of the students is poor. Hence they have to give supplement to their family income; as a result it holds back their studies.
- Insufficient staff in the Library.

8. Plans of institution for next year:

- Increased use of ICT.
- Purchase of books, journals and newspapers to enrich the Central Library as well as departmental libraries.
- Subscription of E-journals.
- Enrichment of book bank for poor students.
- Opening of Non-conventional and vocational subjects.
- Initiatives to be taken for receiving Govt. Concurrence and financial assistance for Science Stream.
- Filling the vacant posts.
- Purchase of more teaching aids and computers especially for the departments.
- Construction of Car parking shed.
- Construction of additional rooms for IDOL Study Centre & computer lab.
- Appointment of regular teachers in place of part-time teachers in the science stream.
- To make the college campus more eco friendly.
