PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Mankachar College was established in 1971 with Arts Stream alone. An organizing meeting for establishing the college was held on the 8th day of March, 1970 in the J.M.H.S. School premises with Late Zahirul Islam, the then MLA of Mankachar I.A. Constituency in the chair. He was the President of the Organizing Governing Body of the college and Sri Shankarlal Agarwala, M.Com, LL.B. was the Secretary of the college till 1981. The college came under Deficit Grants-in-Aid system on 1st September, 1981. The general people of the locality contributed generously for the development of the college. So, the college was nomenclature as "Mankachar College". The College is affiliated to Gauhati University and registered under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act. 1956.

The College started with 68 male and 11 female students in the Mankachar J.M.H.S. School premises with the classes being taken in the morning shift. The college was shifted to its own campus in January, 1979. The land of the college was donated in the memory of Late Fazal Sheikh of Sarkarpara by members of his family on the 26th day of May 1973.

Subsequently, in 1999, science stream at the degree level has been introduced to meet the requirement of the aspiring students of the locality. However, this stream is yet to be provincialised.

Shri Mihir Kr. Dev, M.A., B.T., E.T. the founder principal of the college adorned the principal's chair for a pretty long period of time till his retirement on 28th February, 1999. He was succeeded by Dr. Ahijuddin Sheikh. On Dr. Sheikh's transfer to Moirabari College, Dr. Sailendra Narayan Thakuria took over as i/c. Principal, Prof. Akheruzzaman, He was succeeded Dr. Thakuriya on his retirement on 31.03.2011 as i/c Principal. He was succeeded by Dr. abed Ali as regular Principal of the college on 31.01.2012 and Dr ali continued to be the principal of the of the college till his retirement on 28.02.2021. He was succeeded by P.C. Mohapatra, M.A. (English), B.Ed., P.G.C.T.E. as i/c Principal on 01.03.2021 and Prof. Mohapatra continues to be i/c Principal of the college till his retirement on 31.03.2022. He was succeeded by Dr. Sudipta Dutta, M.A., Ph.D, as i/c Principal 01/04/2022 and Dr. Dutta continues to be i/c Principal of the collegetill date. Now the college imparts education with an efficient and dedicated teaching staff to nearly one thousand students annually from Higher Secondary to Degree level.

At present, Mankachar College has been playing a vital role as a provincialized college in this educationally, economically and socially backward district of South Salmara-Mankachar in imparting higher education both in Arts and Science streams.

PROCEDURE AND REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION

1. Application for admission to the college should be made in the prescribed form within the stipulated date. Prospectus and Forms may be collected from the college office on payment of Rs. 150/-.
2. Admission into the college will be conducted only on the date of interview. No applications will be accepted after the last date of Admission.
3. Students will be selected strictly on the basis of merit.
4. A few seats are reserved for students belonging to SC/ST(P)/ST(H)/OBC/MOBC as per Government Rules.
5. A few seats are reserved for physically handicapped students and students having outstanding proficiency in sports, culture and N.C.C.
6. Incomplete application forms without attested Photostat copies of required testimonials will be rejected.
7. Casual admission to H.S. and undergraduate classes will be carried out after the Autumn recess.
8. The following documents should be produced at the time of Interview/ Admission:
 - i) Original Mark-Sheet, Certificate of the last qualifying examination, certificate from the Head of the Institution attended last.
 - ii) Students who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year must submit a gap certificate (not exceeding two years) issued by a Gazetted Officer/Head of the Institution last attended regarding their activities during the period.
 - iii) Two copies of recent passport size colour photograph.
 - iv) Original caste certificate from the appropriate authority.

PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

The Principal of the college will notify the date of commencement of classes and fees structure.

Undergraduate Four Year Programme (FYUGP) under NEP 2020

Mankachar College is going to implement the **FYUGP** from the Academic Session 2023-24 as per direction and notifications issued by the Director of Higher Education, Assam as well as the affiliating University. The Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) is based on the National Education Policy (NEP 2020). The New Education Policy recognizes that Higher Education plays a significant role in developing human as well as the overall progress of the society. The FYUGP is designed in such a manner so as to cater to the diverse academic needs of the students. The FYUGP under NEP 2020 offers options of multiple entries and exits and obtain a certificate, a Diploma or a Degree with or without Major.

Curricular Components

The entire curriculum of FYUGP is divided into:

- a) Core Course and b) Common Course

a) Core Course

The Core Course under FYUGP constitutes Majors & Minors. A student will have to choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. The students have to study 21 papers in total over the period of three years programme with total credit allocation of 84.

❖ Major Course:

The College offers the following subjects for Major course consisting of 15 papers with allocation of 60 credits over the period of 3 years.

2. Assamese
3. Political Science
4. Economics
5. History

❖ Minor Course:

The students have to select two Minor subjects from the following and the required credit over the period of 3 years is 12 each which translate into 3 papers or courses.

STUDENTS' UNION

Mankachar College Students' Union is the general body of students in the college. Every regular student of the college shall be a member of this union. The office bearers are elected annually by direct franchise in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and M.C.S.U. Constitution. A regular student who does not have any academic arrears and has at least 75% class attendance shall be eligible for contesting union election provided that a student can't contest twice.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- i) A great emphasis laid on discipline and character building and students are expected to maintain a high standard in and outside the college campus. They are subject to the rules and regulations of the college.
- ii) The student admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violation of the rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, showing discourtesy to the teaching or non-teaching staff in any form, adoption of unfair means in any examination etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable to disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
- iii) Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Any one found involved in ragging will be punished as per law.
- iv) All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

1. College Library:

The Digital Library of the college is well-stocked and fully-computerized. It has around 26500 books covering almost all aspects of Science & Humanities. It regularly subscribes to about 05 Periodicals including 04 daily regional and national level newspapers in Assamese and English. Services offered by the library are circulation of books among the students and faculties, consultation, reference etc. There is also a collection of materials like maps, atlases, etc. The library has comfortable Reading Rooms for students, teachers and visitors. It extends its current awareness services by providing newspapers/ magazines in the Staff Room and the Students' Common Room. The library remains open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. on all working days. It remains closed on Sundays and other gazetted holidays. There is a book bank facility meant for the poor needy students.



2. Modern Teaching Facilities:

The College has ultra-modern audio-visual teaching facilities like teaching with the aid of power board, LCD projector, etc. The College campus including the classrooms is under CCTV surveillance system. There is one computer centre in the college with 35 computers having Internet facilities. It provides basic computer education to the teachers, students and staff.

3. College Hostel:

The college has a hostel for girls only. The total seat capacity of the hostel is 100. The students must apply for hostel seat in a separate application form.

4. Sports Facilities:

Sports facilities in the college are available. Each year, students of the College achieve notable distinctions. Facilities are provided for Athletics, Basket Ball, Table Tennis, Volley Ball, Cricket, Badminton, Kabaddi and a number of Indoor games.



5. **Gymnastics Facilities:**

The College has gym facilities with modern equipments. The facilities are available to all the students of the college.



6. **College Canteen:**

The college has well furnished canteen facility inside the campus. The canteen is the hub of out-of-class discussions and exchange of information. It provides snacks, drinks and lunch for the staff and students at reasonable rates.

8. **Digital Class Room:**

The college has a well equipped Digital Class Room for students and for conduction of Seminar, Workshops, Counseling Session etc.



9. **Cycle Stand Facility:**

There is one Cycle Stand for parking of cycles and vehicles in the eastern part of the college.

10. **Photo Copying Facility:**

The Digital Library of the college provides photocopying facility for the students at subsidized rates.

11. Internet Facility:

Students can avail the free Internet facility in the Digital Library of the college.

Mankachar College Magazine is published annually. The magazine gives an opportunity to the students to express their creativity in different literary fields. The magazine is run by an Editorial Board framed by the Principal.



14. Extension Service Cell:

The college has Extension Service Cell that organizes community development programmes, awareness programme etc. in different fields, and seminars, workshops etc. for the overall development of the society.

15. Extra Curricular & Co-Curricular Activities:

- National Service Scheme (N.S.S.):** NSS Cell, Mankachar College Unit is introduced under G.U. from the session 2012-13. This unit will render social service with inside and outside the college campus through the NSS student volunteer. The main aim of the scheme is to enable the student to upgrade their personality and experience through community service. A student enroll in NSS is expected to put in atleast 120 hours of regular NSS Programme in each academic year and shall be entitled to get a certificate on completion of 2 years term i.e. 240 hours and attending atleast one special camp.

The main objective of the unit is to make the Youth Rober Self realization and self reformation and to motivate them towards community service and to teach them the importance of discipline and social responsibilities.
